#### JANUARY 24, 2016

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments, and educational opportunities (including tuition assistance) at our Catholic School. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest at least six months before their wedding. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the home-bound on a regular basis.

**BAPTISM:** Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.

As we celebrate the Third Sunday of the Year, we are reminded of the importance of belonging. All of us desire to belong to someone or something. Each of today's reading reminds us of the importance of belonging to God and our dependency upon Him. It reminds us of the importance of family,

we have our biological family and yet we are part of the larger picture. We belong to the family of God.

In the first reading from the book of Nehemiah, the Jews were reminded that they were identified as belonging to God and what gave them their identity was the Book of the Law. That identity shaped them as a nation and also in their relationship with their God. God once more became their caretaker. The Law was not seen as a burden, but a way to celebrate their relationship with God.

From the second reading taken from Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians, all of the gifts given to the people were there to unite them and were given to benefit the whole and not divide them. These gifts were given to the people to draw them into a deeper relationship with God and truly realize their dependency upon Him. At the same time they were to realize their interdependency upon each other.

In the Gospel from Saint Luke, we read that Jesus is back in his hometown about to preach in the synagogue. Jesus' faith was shaped by Joseph and Mary and his youth growing up in Nazareth and attending synagogue services. Jesus was shaped by His heritage and His faith. So He knew the importance of family and the word of God. He used His hometown to announce the reason why He was born and the mission that His Father in heaven wanted Him to accomplish.

I know the idea that seems to be going around is that God can be worshiped anywhere - why do I need to go to Church? Let me call that "rugged individualism"; it only goes so far. It does not truly meet our needs. Each of the readings reminds us that we need to relate to one another and to our God. Picture a person in a leg cast jumping around trying to walk without accepting the crutch that he/she needs to have a stable walk. Our relationship to one another and with God is the stable walk that we need to live in harmony as one.


