



Lent is a time to turn back more fervently to the Lord and a time to "come clean." For us Catholics, this is best achieved through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

I don't know about you, but the longer I stay away from Confession, the harder it is to return. But, please don't let that stop you. Both Fr Ed and I are quite happy to help you experience God's forgiving love. Forgot the Act of Contrition? We have copies for you to read. Forgot what to say? We

are ready and eager to help you.

One thing I've learned about this Sacrament is that the inspiration is not one-way. In other words, there are so many times that someone will come to me for Confession – and then I realize how I need this grace myself. Then, I seek out a priest in order to celebrate this encounter with the Lord. We had a penance service this past Tuesday at our Day of Recollection for priests in Titusville. The bishop provides several opportunities for us confessors to receive the sacrament ourselves throughout the year – Emmaus, Chrism Mass, Retreat, and even almost every week. It's our way of working on our own holiness.


We have Confessions (Sacrament of Penance / Reconciliation) on Saturdays after the 9 am Mass in the Divine Mercy Chapel. We use the conference room adjacent to the chapel from around 9:30 until no more people come. Also, Saturdays before the 4 pm Mass in the church reconciliation rooms. We begin around 3 pm and have to break at 3:45 in order to prepare for Mass. We also have a time on Sunday, April 6. Fr Ed and I both will be in the church from 2:00 pm to 3:00 pm, and if we need to go longer, that's fine. In addition, we have a time on Thursday, April 3 from 4:30 pm till we're done. This happens every month on the day before First Friday.

And, if none of these times work for you, call for an appointment. We're very glad to offer this powerful experience of God's grace at the right time for you. Fr John





BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.
