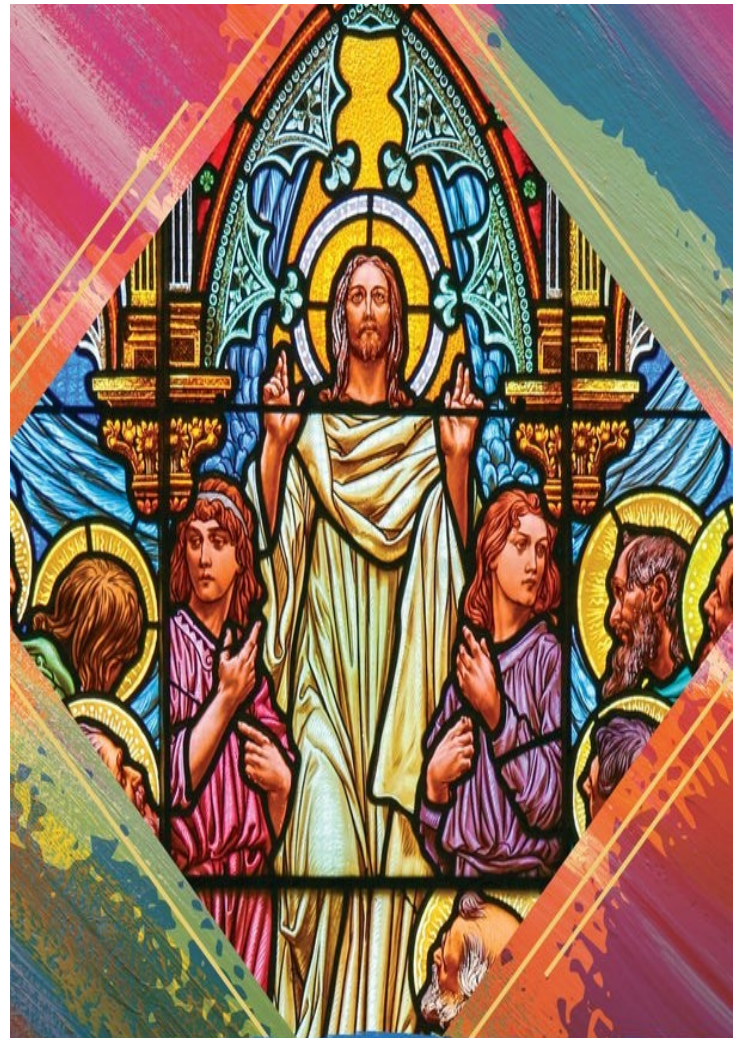

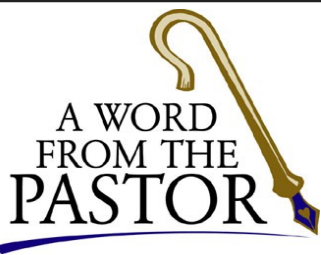

We begin our Lenten observance on Wednesday (Ash Wednesday). We'll have Masses at 8 am & 12:10 pm in the church, as well as a shorter Liturgy of the Word at 5:30 pm. Ashes are distributed after the Gospel and homily – not at the end of Mass. On the following Wednesdays, we'll have Way of the Cross (Stations) at 5:30 pm in the church.

With Lent, the 8 am Daily Mass (M,W,Th) becomes 12:10 pm. We had this Mass in the church before, but the last two years, we never saw 30 people, except perhaps once. For consistency's sake, we'll have all the weekday Masses in the Divine Mercy Chapel. Thus, it will be: Monday 9 & 12:10, Tuesday 9, Wednesday 12:10, Thursday 9 & 12:10, Friday 12:10. This preserves the growing popularity of brunch after the Tuesday and Thursday 9 am Masses. Weekend Masses will remain the same.

With bringing over the St Francis 9 am Daily Masses into the Divine Mercy Chapel, we realize that 8 am Mass has fewer attendees. Therefore, we may well keep the Lenten schedule as our long-term Daily Mass schedule. I've been surveying Daily Mass participants and more seem to like this approach, compared to "keeping as is" or other alternatives.

But with damage, trash, and small thefts, we will begin limiting hours of church being open for prayer. We will open church around 11 am and closing at 1 pm on a daily basis except Wednesdays in Lent. It'll be open on Saturday afternoons prior to Confessions and Mass. The Divine Mercy Chapel will continue to be open during office hours (until 4) Monday-Friday.

We're also going to tighten up office entry, since we've had a few surprising moments with strangers. This will eventually mean that we'll have an ID fob and doorbell / buzzer system – as other local churches have. I had been hoping to keep everything super accessible, but realize that's not being smart in the times we find ourselves.

And, we realize that "no one likes change, except a wet baby."

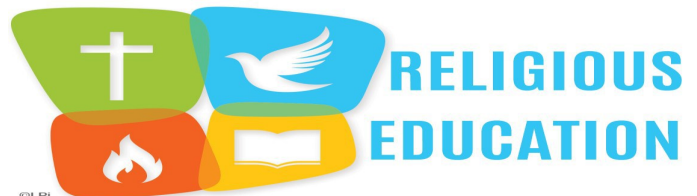

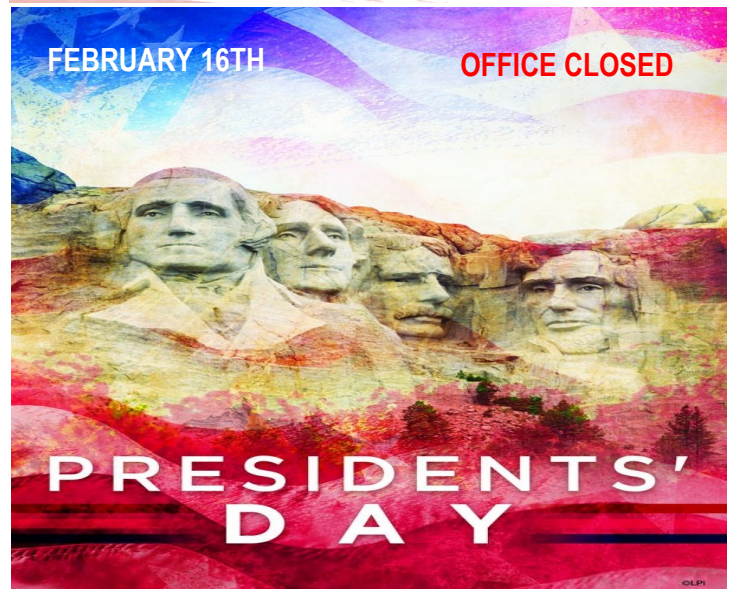

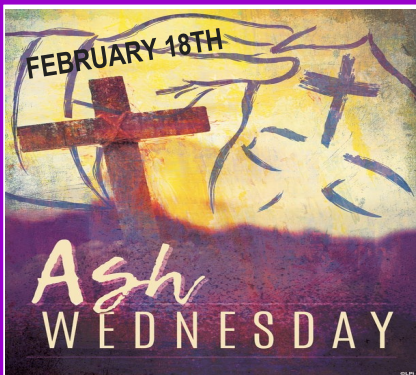

LENTEN PRACTICES 2026

Traditional Lenten practices of **PRAYER, FASTING**, and **ALMSGIVING**, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.

ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT, and **GOOD FRIDAY** are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.

ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY are also days of fasting for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On those days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the home-bound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.

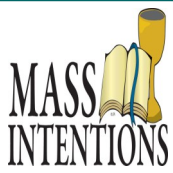
