

We are always in need of some inspiration and have our spirits lifted. Here are a couple of books that have recently done that for me.

Anna Lembke gifted us all with **Dopamine Nation**: Finding Balance in the Age of Indulgence (2021). This psychiatrist explores the pleasure experience we all get from various sources, especially now that so many of these are ready at hand. She relates stories from her various

patients that have become addicted to so many things – and not the usual suspects – and readily offers ways she herself has succumbed to various addictions (including sexy romance novels). Her clear presentation and admission that she herself is vulnerable by her self-disclosure makes this a remarkably good eye-opening and moving book well worth our time. Having read several on this topic, I believe this is the most accessible.

A little fiction, too, is good. Conclave (2016) by Robert Harris is a page-turner recently made into a movie (which garnered some Academy Award nominations). This would be about the death of a pope and the election of the next – with a few interesting political plot twists. One thing with which I would take issue is a disclosure or confrontation of a candidate following the Sacrament of Penance. This would be a violation of the seal of Confession. Another would be the scheming done by a couple of the cardinals in order to have their candidacy for the papacy raised. I'm fairly sure most would feel as the Dean (Cardinal Lomeli) does – a feeling of unworthiness and desire to not be seriously considered. Harris does largely understand the process, although he seems to neglect the Liturgy of the Hours. Still, it will effectively hold your attention.

And some non-fiction as well. Erik Larsen did it again with *In the Garden of Beasts* (2011). It is the story of William Dodd, a professor who was tapped to be the U.S. Ambassador to Germany and served in 1933-34. Those were the first years Adolf Hitler came to power in that country and proved to be a most dangerous time and anything but normal kinds of work for a diplomat. Dodd was harshly criticized in his day for not "doing more," but is credited with sounding the alarm of the rise of threats to European and world security. This fascinating book explores the life of his family and their acquaintances during Fr. John those very challenging days.

MISSIONARY CO-OPERATIVE VISIT & COLLECTION (May 17th & 18th) From the very beginning, the Augustinians of the Assumption (Assumptionists) have been engaged in a wide variety of apostolic works. All that advances the coming of the Reign of God has always been deemed worth of our apostolic energy.

It's a preference for poor, in response to the Gospel and to the Church calling us today to be on their side. For us too, it's a consequence of our own vow to live as poor men. Some will dedicate themselves full-time to this work: with marginalized people of every kind, in hospitals and in prisons, "worker priests" or volunteers in different organizations...But all of us try to live in union with the poor, because "the poor will always be with us", because the poor are too often neglected even within the Church. This is a bias that the Assumption encourages.

Our Province of North America is specifically responsible for the missions in East Africa (Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania), Mexico and the Philippines. We provide personnel and financial assistance that is indispensable in order to maintain our charitable works (schools and nurseries) and formation programs for both laity and clergy in these countries. Many of our apostolates in these countries specifically work to better the living conditions of the impoverished brothers and sisters we live with and minister to. In the Philippines, we sponsor education and aid programs for underprivileged villages both in the Manilla area and in other mission centers. Our parish in Orizaba, Veracruz Mexico ministers to an underserved indigenous community.

# BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

**MEMBERSHIP:** All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

**MARRIAGE:** Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

#### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.

**BAPTISM:** Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.
