

"Jimmy" made his first confession last March. When "Jimmy's" class was preparing to go to confession (his second time), he and some other third grade students told the pastor that they wished they could come to Church on Sunday. Before the pastor could ask why, several children gave the following reasons: "My Mom and Dad sleep on Sundays;" "I'm with my Dad on weekends;" "We'll go when I make my First Communion." This was in the context of a class visit. Kids say the darndest things!

"Susie" is in sixth grade this year – Middle School. She loves school and she made Honor Roll this quarter. She is a cheer-leader, second-string on the basketball team, and has been taking piano lessons "forever." She meets her pastor in the grocery store parking lot and before he can say anything she says, "Do you remember me, Father? I made my First Communion when you came to our church. My Mom says that we don't have time to go to church on Sundays because I have so many activities. I start soccer practice next Sunday. My grandparents want me to be confirmed, so do I have to go to church to do that?" Kids say the darndest things.

These first two paragraphs are taken almost verbatim from the St Bernard Parish newsletter "The Clear Voice" printed December 1997 (twenty-seven years ago). But they are pertinent today. The number of extracurricular activities for school-age children has dramatically increased – and so have the excuses for skipping religious education classes.

There are many parents who don't want to see their children miss out on the opportunities to excel at various skills, but it does seem, sadly, that faith formation and discipleship get more and more sidelined. I guess we shouldn't be surprised. But our parish is making big efforts to increase the attractiveness of our sessions, changing our methods and curriculum, and the result is increasingly empty gatherings of children. Will it all erode away? The students who do come today are some of the very best in the area! We'd like to see more of them at Sunday Mass – so they can grow their relationship with the Lord. I believe we have some other great young people, too, whom I haven't yet had the opportunity to meet.

Serious questions to consider as we look to the future. Remember the remarks that my brother priest, Fr Scott Detisch, wrote - about Burger King Catholicism in a Netflix World?

PROCESSIONS: GIFT AND COMMUNION — We discontinued the practice of bringing the bread, wine, and collection forward to the altar during the pandemic. It's time to bring this meaningful gesture back into our liturgy. Our greeters and ushers will be looking for family volunteers to help, especially if the Intention for this Mass is a member of your family. If you don't care to do this, just let them know when you arrive for Mass and we'll find someone else from the assembly to bring these items. We also hope to begin bringing more order to the Communion procession — so, please wait until the greeter or usher approached your pew. You may remain kneeling or seated until that time. We truly hope that this will increase the reverence of our Eucharistic celebrations. We hope to begin these next weekend, November 9th & 10th.

<u>GREETERS & USHERS</u> — On Wednesday, November 6, there is an important brief meeting for these ministers to review the new procedures: gift procession and Communion procession. There are two times – to make it convenient. 1 pm and 6:30 pm. We will meet at St Francis Church, where we worship currently. The meeting should last less than 30 minutes.



STAINED-GLASS WINDOWS AT OMPH — The stained-glass windows at Our Mother of Perpetual Help have been removed and will be taken to a church warehouse for distribution elsewhere. We are, unfortunately, not able to make them available to parishioners — according to diocesan policy. But the bottom panel, with donors' names, ARE available. They will need to be removed at a cost of \$260. We know that some families very much want these as keepsakes. It seems the same process will be underway for the St Francis Church stained-glass as well. Please contact the office if you are interested.




Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments-Bullying is defined as any unwanted aggressive behavior by another youth or group of youths that involves an observed or perceived power imbalance and is repeated multiple times or is highly likely to be repeated. 20% of youth ages 12-18 experience bullying. When adults respond quickly to bullying behavior, they send the message that bullying is not acceptable. There are ways parents can make a positive difference. Parents can educate themselves on the signs that a child is being bullied or is a bully. Parents should keep the lines of communication open with their child and model for their child how to treat others. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. **MARRIAGE:** Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.
