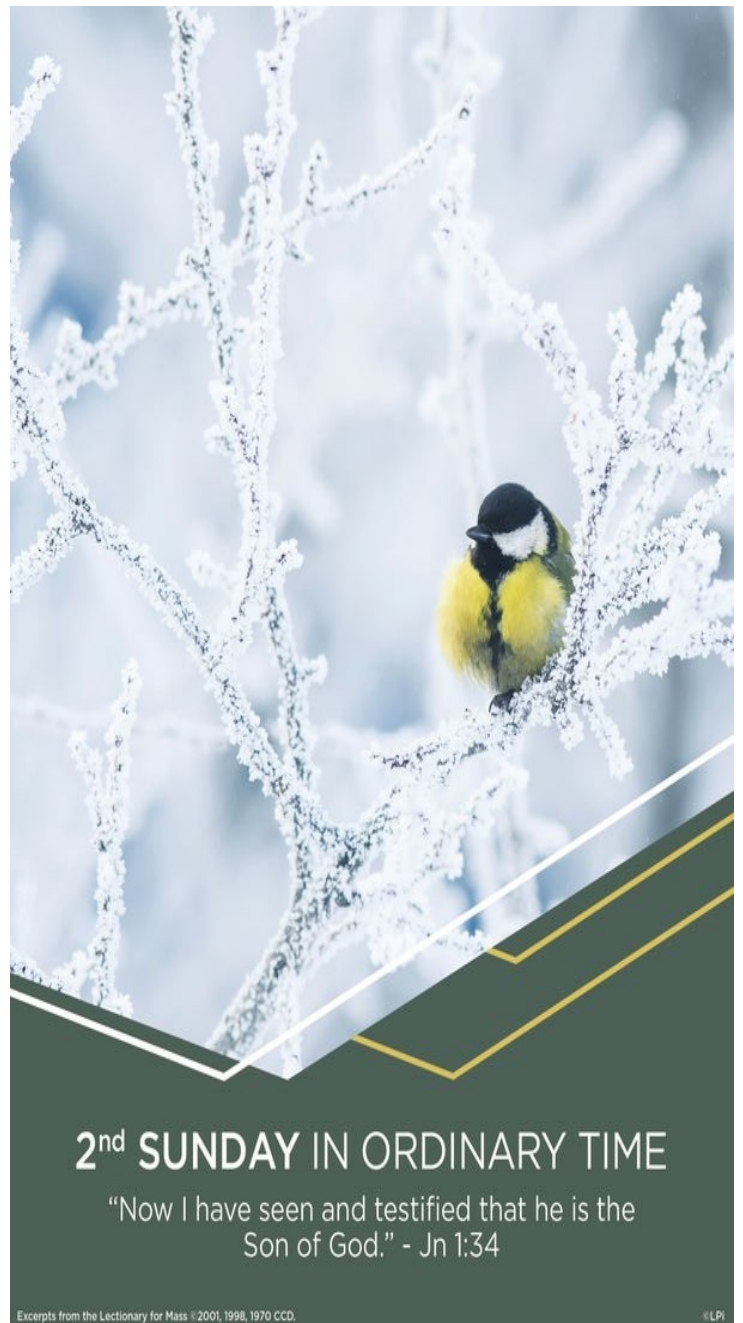

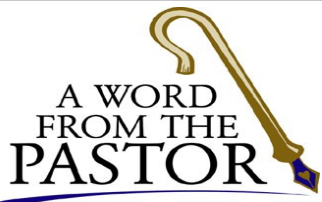

This week, let's take a quick look at a couple of books I perused during my sabbatical. (Almost thirty-five altogether.)

Maureen Day wrote about **Cultural Catholics** (2025) and described the situation of many who have left the practice of the faith and perhaps why. The moral norms, as grasped by generations today, have changed dramatically. One factor, Catholics seem less enthused about *being* Catholic – thus there's a substantially less magnetic pull toward participation. That could also be related to the fact that less prayer is going on with infrequent attenders (a kind of vicious cycle). In addition, younger Catholics want to *do* something – serve, help make things better. They are often either neglected or few opportunities are presented. Ministries to very practical issues are more likely to gather the critical mass – than purely “spiritual” opportunities. Better preaching and evangelization efforts are also helpful.

Sabbath, by Wayne Muller (1999) was the first book we all encountered on our four-month hiatus. I can recommend it for laying out the various components of what and why we need to take daily, weekly, monthly, and annual rest periods. Not just to “cease,” but also to engage in experiences that will recharge and re-spark our lives.

The guide that helped us begin our conversations and faith sharing was **The Enduring Heart** by Wilkie Au (2000), an especially insightful book that posed good questions at the end of each chapter. We were better able to identify the hazards and distractions that keep us from being most mindful and conscious of our loving God. While responding to one of the questions, I was able to recognize the hand of God active in my earlier struggles with problems as they became resolved by natural (and supernatural) means. I was further convinced that “with God all things are possible.” (Matthew 19:26, Luke 1:37). These insights also helped spark a deeper exploration with my spiritual director, a grandmother who was certified for this work decades ago. Carol was a real gift!

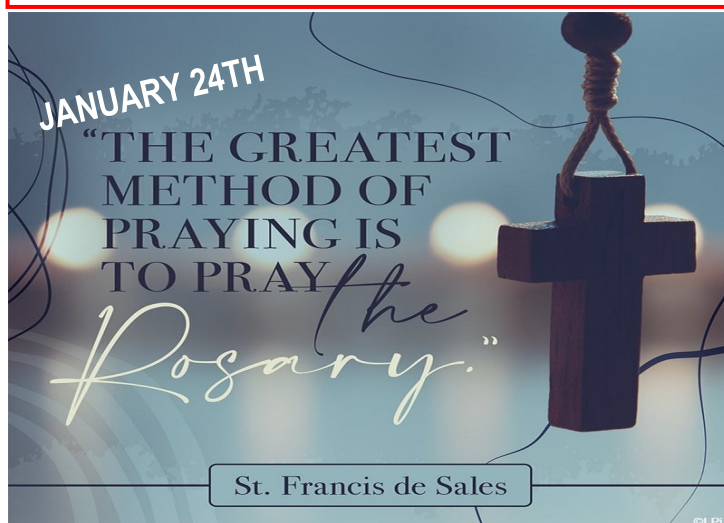

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the home-bound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.

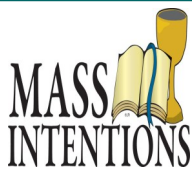
