

What are the next steps in our consolidation of parishes process? We would like to, step by step, "decommission" St Francis Church. After this, it would benefit our parish to liquidate this resource and utilize the proceeds to further the essential mission of our consolidated parish community.

It is not easy to erect a parish (by definition, a stable community of the Christian faithful).

Parishes exist primarily to provide for the sacramental and spiritual needs of the people in this territory, entrusted to a pastor. And they normally utilize a church, a sacred building designated for the public exercise of divine worship. These take substantial time to establish and construct. Hence, they also take substantial effort and discernment to "undo."

St Francis Parish was erected in 1945 (along with Our Mother of Perpetual Help) and St Francis Church was constructed and dedicated (consecrated) in 1951. It was independent of St Bernard's – as was St Bernard's when it was erected in 1870 from St Mary's in Sartwell.

On Thursday, January 8th, Fr Joe Petrone (Assistant Chancellor of the Erie Diocese) presented information to members of the Pastoral and Finance Councils to outline the process.

In church (canon) law, a grave cause must be identified in order for the relegation of a church building. St Francis was modified from "parish" to "secondary church with mission status." It retained this designation while we transferred all Masses, funerals and weddings to this site during our renovations to St Bernard Church (April-December 2024). We had then decided with the Pastoral Council to transfer all such liturgical celebrations to St Bernard's upon the completion of the refurbishing.

Last August, St Francis was further modified to "secondary church without mission status" since it seemed that there was a merging of parish worship and not a need to continue to worship at St Francis further. Bishop Persico issued this decree on August 7, 2025, which was publicized in many ways. It did mean, however, that we were to celebrate the patronal feast day (St Francis of Assisi – October 4th) and to ensure the church was open for visitation and prayer at least on a weekly basis (which we continue to do on Fridays from 8-3).



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM (REP)

REP Coordinator: Cindy Greek

Students not attending Catholic school should be enrolled in REP programs. The Bradford Catholic Community Religious Education program is Grades 1—5 & Grades 6—9 (Confirmation). Please call the parish office for more information.

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the home-bound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.
