



What an Easter surprise. Pope Francis died on Easter Monday, while my colleague and fellow St Mary Seminary alumnus, Fr Monty Sayers, died the night before. Both of these Church leaders inspired me.

Rev. B. LaMounte Sayers grew up in DuBois and had been an elementary teacher when he felt the tug toward seminary. Ordained in August 1986 at St Catherine Church, he served wherever the

bishop needed him, but most of his years were in Clarion, both as Newman Chaplain where he had earned his teaching degree and later pastor of Immaculate Conception Church.

Archbishop Jorge Bergoglio was the "surprise" choice of the conclave during Lent 2013, after the surprising resignation of Pope Benedict XVI the month before. Benedict inspired us by his acknowledgement that the Church needed someone with more energy to lead, and Francis by the choice of name, where he would reside, and how he would focus the Church on the poor and the peripheries. God's faithful servants in these past couple of pontificates have helped us all to know and encounter Jesus in profoundly good ways.


Benedict's first encyclical *Deus Caritas Est* focused us all on the primacy of Christ's commandments – love of God and love of neighbor. He even included discussion of *eros* – since that is the "romantic" feeling people tend to experience universally. Who would have ever expected this from the Doctrine of the Faith's watchdog?


Francis's first apostolic exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium*, "Joy of the Gospel" set the tone for all that was to come during his 12 years. With his remarkable travels and sensitivity to those who suffer, he caught the attention of the world. I heard grumblings when I visited his native Argentina in September 2022 – "Why hasn't he visited us?" The political climate was so unstable, he did not want to tip the scales until there was no chance to sway an election, thus he planned to visit later this year.

Each of these pastors have changed the world in good ways. We pray that those soon gathering for the upcoming conclave will be open to the Holy Spirit and succeed yet again.

Rest in Peace, Pope Francis! A good and faithful servant.







The Rosary—-Christians have used beads to mark the recitation of prayers since ancient times, but in the 12th century, the Rosary emerged as a meditative devotion centering on significant moments in the lives of Jesus and Mary. In the words of St. Leo

XIII, "there is no more excellent way of praying." Over the centuries, the formula of the devotion eventually took the shape of 50 Hail Marys divided into five "decades," with each decade focused on a different mystery. The Church has defined the Joyful Mysteries (to be recited on Saturdays and Mondays), the Glorious Mysteries (Sundays and Wednesdays), the Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesdays and Fridays), and most recently the Luminous Mysteries (to be recited on Thursdays).





MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.
