



GOSPEL MEDITATION: ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven—his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.




Adult Faith Formation Class - Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible

BISHOP'S SPECIAL COLLECTION Per Bishop Persico's letter in the August 24th bulletin, we are taking up a collection this weekend for the assistance of Christians and other innocent victims of violence in Gaza and surrounding areas. Many are struggling to survive, protect their children and live with dignity in dire conditions. Bishop Persico asks that you give generously to this Special Collection. Thank you!

Question— What Happens if Someone Drops a Consecrated Host?

Despite our best efforts, and this is as true in our liturgical celebrations as in all of life, accidents happen. Occasionally at Mass, a host may be dropped or some of the Precious Blood could even be spilled from the chalice, despite the best efforts of the priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers of holy Communion assisting at the liturgy.

So, when a host is dropped or the Precious Blood is spilled, we can take guidance from the U.S. Bishops' statement Norms for the Distribution for Holy Communion Under Both Kinds:

All ministers of Holy Communion should show the greatest reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist by their demeanor, their attire, and the manner in which they handle the consecrated bread or wine. Should there be any mishap — as when, for example, the consecrated wine is spilled from the chalice — then the affected "area . . . should be washed with water, and this water should be then poured into the sacrarium."

According to no. 280 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, the general rule is that a dropped host is picked up by the minister distributing Communion and reverently consumed. The minster should be careful to make sure that no other particles from the host remain on the ground. As we see in the instruction from the bishops, the Precious Blood would be absorbed (customarily with a purificator) and the area attentively and reverently washed with water which would then be disposed of properly. ©LPi




SEPTEMBER 11 NEVER FORGET

On September 8th each year, the Catholic Church celebrates one of its most ancient and beloved Marian feasts: the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This sacred day invites us to contemplate the humble beginning of she who would become the Mother of God, and to recognize how God's plan of salvation unfolds through the most ordinary and extraordinary moments of human life. The enduring nature of this celebration speaks to the deep reverence Christians have always held for Mary's role in the mystery of the Incarnation. While the Gospels do not provide details about Mary's birth, sacred tradition has preserved the beautiful account of her parents, Saints Joachim and Anne. According to the ancient text known as the Protoevangelium of James, this holy couple endured many years of childlessness—a source of great sorrow in their culture—before God blessed them with the gift of Mary. Their story mirrors that of other biblical couples like Abraham and Sarah, or Hannah and Elkanah, showing us how God often works through apparent impossibility to accomplish His greatest works. Mary's nativity represents far more than the birth of a child; it marks the beginning of the final chapter of salvation history. In Mary, we see God preparing the perfect vessel for the Incarnation of His Son.
