




Once in a while, I get to read someone else's bulletin. These two articles were so well-written by a brother priest, Fr Scott Detisch, pastor of St John's, Girard, that I'd like to share the gist of them with you.

Fr Scott comments that consumerism is creeping into our religious practices. We desire to have things the way we want them in the time-frame most convenient to ourselves. "Have it your way" anytime you want it. He calls this Burger King Catholicism in a Netflix World.

Maybe this is why we see different attitudes toward religious practice these days. Here are some examples:

- 1. Parents sending children to Religious Education classes but never bringing them to Mass.
- 2. Families demanding that Religious Education not interfere with sports, dance, robotics, or other activities which have increased over the years.
- 3. Children only attending Religious Education in the years they receive a sacrament (First Reconciliation, First Communion, Confirmation), skipping the other years.
- 4. People claiming to be Catholic, wanting to be approved as a Godparent or Confirmation sponsor, but not coming to Mass.
- 5. Young parents wanting their children baptized, but showing no commitment to practicing the Catholic faith (which they promise to do during the rite).
- 6. People picking and choosing the Catholic teachings with which they already agree, that make no demands on their present lifestyle while rejecting the other teachings which might call for changes in attitudes, behaviors, and way of life.
- 7. Engaged couples who want a church wedding because of family tradition or the beauty of the church setting, but do not participate in the practice of the faith.
- 8. Church-goers who are always at Mass, but do not recognize the need to bring the gospel message into their jobs, businesses, social groups, sports, arts, or other interests, or their relationships and commitments.

This brand of Catholicism is what the majority of our young people experience. It is what makes the religious faith formation of our youth so difficult. Next week, we'll look at some of the ways you can help – and we do need your help. ~ Fr John and Fr Scott







MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the home-bound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.
