



Well, there are a few things that remain to be completed since our main renovation efforts. Some accessibility issues are still needing to be addressed, particularly some kind of way to open the outside and inside doors with assistance (electric openers). We have a ramp; we just don't have the door openers.

The server sacristy needs organized (desperately) and cleaned out. There is snow and ice falling just outside the east (Tops) entrance of the church – a hazard and a problem with keeping the walkway clear. A fence needs to enclose the chiller unit behind the church. The exterior brickwork needs

attention, with re-pointing to be done on the lowest areas of the building. We could also use our lanterns (chandeliers) with energy conserving LED bulbs, rather than the fluorescent bulbs they now have.

The new armchairs also have the potential to scratch the LVT (luxury vinyl tile) flooring, and so they will need to be fitted with small Teflon sliders.

We also need to compose a document to seek the relegation of St. Francis from sacred worship to "profane, but not sordid, use." This declaration by the bishop will need the endorsement of the Presbyteral (Priest) Council and can only be done for grave reasons, which must be spelled out and agreed to. Once this process is underway, we will schedule a final "decommissioning" Mass with all respect that is due. We also need to remove some of the sacred furnishings, including the stained glass windows.

Meanwhile the pastor needs some repairs, also. You might remember that I was scheduled for a sabbatical leave in San Antonio, Texas, which was to have begun January 14. However, the need for hip replacement surgery has pushed that back into August. The surgery date is Feb 10th and will take me out for two weeks, at least. Fr. John


