





This weekend sees over 300 Confirmation students, catechists, religious education leaders and priests visiting our Pitt-Bradford campus for the Diocesan Confirmation Retreat. This event has been coordinated by our Diocesan Faith Formation department who have been working assiduously for months to make sure this will be successful.

Bishop Persico will also be here for the day and wants to get a peek at our renovation work. He also wants to enjoy a little time here in town as well.

Cindy Greek and I are working to prepare seven teenaged boys (aren't there any girls?) for the Sacrament of Confirmation. That celebration is scheduled at St Bernard's on Sunday, June 1<sup>st</sup>, along with youth from both Potter and McKean Counties. We're using a newer approach, "Purpose," which is part of the Life Teen Ministries. If you want to see a little of what we're doing, I highly recommend you take a look at two of the videos they have produced – "Fr McSpeedy's Confirmation" and "The Hospital." We also have a few students in our Religious Education program that missed out on their sacraments (baptism, penance, eucharist). So, a couple of us are spending time helping them get "up to speed" and encounter the Lord in these wonderful ways. Your prayers and support are most welcome! *Fr. John* 

**PROCESSIONS: GIFT AND COMMUNION** — We discontinued the practice of bringing the bread, wine, and collection forward to the altar during the pandemic. It's time to bring this meaningful gesture back into our liturgy. Our greeters and ushers will be looking for family volunteers to help, especially if the Intention for this Mass is a member of your family. If you don't care to do this, just let them know when you arrive for Mass and we'll find someone else from the assembly to bring these items. We also hope to begin bringing more order to the Communion procession – so, please wait until the greeter or usher approached your pew. You may remain kneeling or seated until that time. We truly hope that this will increase the reverence of our Eucharistic celebrations. We hope to begin these next weekend, November 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>.

It was founded in 1969 and established in 1970 to respond to both systemic poverty and racial injustice occurring throughout the country. Since beginning its work in 1970, CCHD has awarded over \$462 million in grants supporting more than 12,000 community-based, grassroots-led organizations. The Catholic Campaign for Human Development provides grants to more than 200 low-income, community-led organizations each year, which is made possible thanks to the generous contributions of Catholics to the annual collection every November on the World Day of the Poor.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments-**Bullying** is defined as any unwanted aggressive behavior by another youth or group of youths that involves an observed or perceived power imbalance and is repeated multiple times or is highly likely to be repeated. 20% of youth ages 12-18 experience bullying. When adults respond quickly to bullying behavior, they send the message that bullying is not acceptable. There are ways parents can make a positive difference. Parents can educate themselves on the signs that a child is being bullied or is a bully. Parents should keep the lines of communication open with their child and model for their child how to treat others. #### BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

**MEMBERSHIP:** All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

**MARRIAGE:** Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

#### **RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:**

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:** Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.
