



And, I'm especially touched with the goodness of God who sends a savior into the world – namely his only begotten son, Jesus. God comes personally to redeem, forgive, and give us life eternal with all the saints. These are far beyond the best gifts we will ever otherwise receive.

Advent Wreaths traditionally hold four candles (three purple and one pink). The candles represent Jesus coming as a light in the darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to symbolize that Jesus is with us. This can be referred to as the "Christ Candle". Each of the candles represent an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent.

1st Week-November 30th—Prophecy Candle/Purple: Hope Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. It symbolizes penance, preparation and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent we remembered the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation.

2nd Week-December 7th— Bethlehem Candle/Purple: Peace During this week we reflected on our lives and focused on becoming better-versions-of-our-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem. What has your journey toward Christmas been like so far?

3rd Week-December 14th— Shepherd's Candle/Pink: Joy

This third candle is pink and symbolizes rejoicing. During the third week of Advent we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day. This Sunday is often called "Gaudete Sunday" as we reflect on the joy the shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus. How is Jesus inviting you to experience greater joy this Advent?

4th Week-December 21st—The Angel's Candle/Purple: Love During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of his Son. We reflect on the good news of God's love brought to us from the Angel Gabriel. This is the last week to prepare our hearts for the joy of Christmas. Are you ready?




The Nativity reminds us of the humble birth of Jesus Christ in Bethlehem. Mary and Joseph found shelter in a stable, and there, among animals and shepherds, the Son of God was born. The Nativity scene — or crèche — helps us reflect on this moment, showing figures of the Holy Family, angels, shepherds, wise men and animals gathered around the Christ Child. Bringing out the Nativity at Christmas is a special tradition. Families are encouraged to pray together as they set it up.

Suggested Blessing: Loving God, we give thanks for the gift of Your Son, Jesus. As we look upon this Nativity, may we remember His humble birth and open our hearts to welcome Him each day. Bless this scene and all who gaze upon it, that we may live in hope, peace, joy and love. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. Many families place the Baby Jesus in the manger on Christmas Eve, after lighting a candle or singing a carol.



The Nativity of the Lord—Our hearts are aglow with the joy of Christmas! Our senses are alive with the season, from the rich smells of evergreen and gingerbread to the feel of crisp air on our skin and the warmth of a loved one's embrace. At some point in the holiday hustle and bustle, take a few moments of quiet. In the silence, reflect on the other senses of the season. Imagine the cool damp of an animal stable, the earthy smell of hay and feed, and the crisp night air blowing in softly. Imagine kneeling beside an exhausted, joyful mother and a relieved, protective father. Imagine an infant wrapped in cloth scraps held out to your open arms. Imagine holding the infant Jesus. As his eyes meet yours, welcome into your heart the greatest gift of Christmas

Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.
