





Yes, we had fun with the Christmas Parade. Since the date of the parade fell on the feast of St Nicholas, we decided that would be our theme this year. Now, you're not allowed to include Santa Claus in your float, but why not the saint that evolved into this?

Nicholas was the bishop of Myra, today known as Demre, in present day Turkey, a port city on the Mediterranean Sea. He would have attended the Council of Nicaea (nearby) in 325, where the creed was hammered out. It is said that he helped save three girls by his anonymous gift of gold coins to supply marriage dowries for a poor family. This prevented them from being sold into slavery

to make ends meet. Times were very hard in the fourth century.

There are numerous stories and legends about this very revered and saintly Church leader – but there's enough known so that non-Catholics revere him, sometimes more than St Francis of Assisi. He eloquently proclaimed and celebrated Jesus Christ despite persecution of his people and himself.

He is patron saint of children (due to his widely-known and kindly nature), sailors (many came to know him due to the city's commerce), merchants, students, and Russia. I sure wish Russian leadership would learn from this amazing leader.

Catholics in Europe often leave their shoes outside the doors of their bedroom the night of December 5th and find treats in the morning. This is why our float committee gave children along the parade route little paper shoes with gold-wrapped chocolate coins and a tag with a little St Nicholas history.

Thus, the connections with his proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus, in the season we prepare to celebrate his birth.
