

You cannot really appreciate spring unless you had winter. And what an "old fashioned" winter we had this year! And the same could be said about the Paschal Feast. You cannot fully appreciate Easter without the Passion. Holy Week is essential to our complete joy.

This pattern is so frequently encountered. When a joint is replaced, such as my own right hip, you become incapacitated for a while, but after recovery you resume more activity than you were able

to do prior. Same with a dental issue – we all try to avoid that dentist chair, but days later feel so much better and can enjoy eating again.

Jeremiah, on the eve of exile, looked to the years when the people will return in words recorded in chapter 31. After they dwelt in the valley of despair, God proclaims "Shouting, they shall mount the heights of Zion, they shall come streaming to the Lord's blessings, the grain, the wine, and the oil, the sheep and the oxen ... I will turn their mourning into joy, I will console and gladden them after their sorrows." (vv. 12a, 13b).

What makes Friday so Good is that God has chosen to unite completely with us – to give us a share of divinity in our humanity – by volunteering to die a most horrific death. What makes Easter so much better, is that God shows that nothing is impossible.

From all of us – priests, support staff, and leadership here at the Bradford Catholic Community – to all of you – "He is Risen!" Happy Easter! *Fr John*





BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.
