


In 1995 and 1999, I was blessed to have joined in pilgrimages to Israel. The first one I helped to promote and shared the trip with some folks from Clearfield County (I was stationed at St Agnes, Morrisdale, at the time). The second trip was organized by a parishioner from Our Lady of the Lake, Edinboro, and included the wonderful Fr James Peterson, with whom I shared a room and opportunities for daily Mass.


I cannot encourage you enough to see the places Jesus walked and lived and ministered. When you hear the Gospels, you begin to really picture those sites and you can recall the smells and land and sea. In Nazareth, where Gabriel appeared to Mary, in Capernaum where Jesus had his "home base," on the Sea of Galilee where he and the apostles crossed on boats, and in Jerusalem where he taught, died, rose, and ascended to heaven. We also visited Mount Tabor, said to be the place of the Transfiguration (and also the battle where the judge Deborah was leader of Israel). And so many other places, such as Mount Carmel.

Of course, it is unsafe to visit this area presently, due to Israel's war in the Gaza Strip. Some groups who had been on pilgrimage during the October 7, 2023 attack had to be quickly and safely evacuated, cutting short their own experience.

Many people here provide hospitality and make articles for sale to the pilgrims (who are not tourists – there's a big difference), and they have been struggling to make ends meet. Also, the Franciscans, who had been given charge of these sacred sights centuries ago, have not had visitors (or generous donations) to continue to keep these places open and accessible.

Thus, we have this special collection – on Good Friday – (but you can contribute on Easter, too) – in order to help sustain this critical and priceless ministry. I will be generous myself, since I've seen firsthand all that they do to keep these holy places open. If you lost the envelope in your packet, just use a plain envelope specially marked. Thank you for helping to keep these places open for generations to come.

NOTE: All students who took Rice Bowls, please place them in the offertory basket during Holy Week.





BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes. you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest at least six months before their wedding. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This RCIA process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class.
