



A couple weeks ago, I mentioned how we will likely fall short of our goal for the Catholic Services Appeal. I want to thank those who responded to that appeal. Also, when I was pastor of Our Lady of the Lake Church, Edinboro, there was a Finance Council member who helped me understand something I had not before considered.

If you say, "I'm giving X dollars to the parish, I'll split it between the regular offertory and the CSA. Since the regular collection stays in the parish, I'll give a lot more there." However, this approach is


counterproductive. The parish takes money from the regular collection in order to make up the shortfall in the CSA collection. This is what St Bernard's is doing now. But if the CSA goes over goal, the parish keeps the extra.

The CSA goal is calculated by a formula that depends in part on the regular collection, the more the regular collection goes up, the higher the CSA "goal" (essentially assessment). IF, however, I took my X dollars and gave more of them to the CSA and less to the regular collection, we would meet our goal *and* the extra dollars collected in the blue envelopes goes to the parish. The CSA goal is reduced, because the offertory number goes down. See?

So, if we "apportioned" our total contribution differently, more money stays in the parish. By giving more in the regular collection, it is "double taxed," according to this council member. His name? Leonard Flanigan. He grew up right here at St Bernard's. He helped us understand this.

If we think about it, this approach makes sense. And we will be heeding the incentive that is built into this formula for calculation. I'll remind you about this next year as we begin a new Catholic Services Appeal.




## 2025 Wedding Anniversary Celebration with Bishop Persico





## BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

**MARRIAGE:** Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

#### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.

**BAPTISM:** Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.
