






Last week, I mentioned an article "The Anti-Social Century" by Derek Thompson in *Atlantic* magazine. It makes a lot of good points.

He begins by describing a local Mexican restaurant. They are busy – not with eat-in customers, but with take-out, so much so they have to close the bar – it's the only place to line up all the phone-in orders. Of course, COVID contributed to this, but you could say the same about movies. Theaters are practically empty (or closed – like ours or St Marys'). People prefer livestreaming, it seems – but they miss out on the social dimension of enjoying the film with friends and strangers. And this

contributes to our experience of isolation and loneliness.

Smartphones have exacerbated the problem – and all these issues are especially affecting our teenagers. Social media does not fulfill our need for live in-person social interaction. Now, add AI (artificial intelligence) to our daily lives and see what happens.

An experiment was proposed. Commuters were told to either engage others in conversation on the bus or train or keep to themselves. After a few weeks, those who had "broken the ice" found themselves feeling better, than those who had imposed introverted behavior. We are essentially social, and to deny ourselves this interaction harms us. Derek Thompson writes, "Our mistaken preference for solitude could emerge from a misplaced anxiety that other people aren't that interested in talking with us, or that they would find our company bothersome... Many people, it seems, are not social enough for their own good. They too often seek comfort in solitude, when they would actually find joy in connection." (p.36)

"One reason, perhaps, that the decline of socializing has synchronized with the decline of religion is that nothing has proved as adept at inscribing ritual into our calendars as faith." (p.38)



Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)

Under current federal tax law, individuals are required to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from his/her tax-deferred retirement plan(s) for the year in which he/she turns 73 and for all subsequent years.

However, even before reaching the age requirement for taking a RMD, he/she may make a tax-free Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from his/her tax-deferred (Regular) IRA after reaching the age of 70½. QCD contributions may be made to St. Bernard Catholic Church and/or any organization that qualifies under Section 501(c)(3) of the US Internal Revenue Code. If the individual is required to take an RMD, the amount of any QCD contributions counts toward the required amount of the RMD.

The advantage of contributing a QCD to St. Bernard and/ or other qualified organizations is that you may be able to make more generous contributions since these charitable distributions from your IRA are not taxed. Also, making such contributions will not decrease the standard deduction for which you are eligible when filing your federal income tax return. To make a QCD contribution, you should contact your tax-deferred retirement plan custodian.

A FAMILY PERSPECTIVE





BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.
