


The Bishop has issued a decree regarding St Francis of Assisi church in Bradford. Back in March 2023, he merged St Francis of Assisi Parish into St Bernard of Clairvaux Parish. Thus, it was no longer a parish, *per se*, but a secondary mission church of St Bernard Parish. By diocesan law, Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation were permitted in St Francis of Assisi church.

At that time, Our Mother of Perpetual Help church in Lewis Run, already a secondary church with mission status, became a *secondary church without mission status*. Thus, Sunday and holy day Masses were no longer permitted there. But Our Mother of Perpetual Help was to remain open to the faithful at least occasionally with Mass celebrated each year on the solemnity of the church's title.

Subsequently, the Bishop decreed that Our Mother of Perpetual Help church would be relegated to profane but not sordid use, according to the canon law of the Church (canon 1222.2), effective July 1, 2023. This decree spells out several factors that led to this decision, which, when combined, constitute the necessary "grave cause." In this case, the Bishop was required to consult with the Pastoral Council and Finance Council of the parish, the pastor himself, and the Presbyteral Council of the Erie Diocese.

Essentially, the Bishop is now reducing the status of St Francis of Assisi church to a *secondary church without mission status*, as of this month. Therefore, as before with Lewis Run, St Francis is to remain open the faithful occasionally (we do so on Fridays from 8-3) and celebrate Feast of St Francis with Mass. Since that day is a Saturday, we may anticipate it on Friday, October 3rd this year.


Some of the parish leadership will be meeting soon with the Bishop to plan our next steps – toward relegation (you might call it "secularization") of this sacred space, difficult as that will be, in order to continue the consolidation process of the Bradford Catholic Community. This is not easy or simple, but the necessary direction in order to fulfill the path agreed upon by our Pastoral Planning Committee in communion with Bishop Persico back in 2022 and continually supported by both our Pastoral and Finance Councils.

polivine MERCY SUNDAY If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Mandated Reporters in the Diocese of Erie are people who hold positions of trust in our schools, parishes, agencies, and institutions and are mandated by Pennsylvania law and the diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children to report suspected abuse of a minor. All employees and volunteers working/serving for the Diocese of Erie, in our parishes, schools or agencies are mandated reporters both legally and morally obligated to report any reasonable suspected or known child abuse to ChildLine, the local police, or other appropriate agency. On April 15, President Craig Cuthbertson gathered with Jeff Hilzinger, Doug Kuntz, Dan Lang, Karen McClain, Kim VanHorn, Bill Leven, Mike Kozminski, Harry Solarek, Joan Yohe, Fr Ed Walk, and Fr John Jacquel (Kim Ditz was excused) to discuss the following: Ministerium efforts, the plan for Aug 9 (Saturday Mass during Italian Festival), RCIA this year, moving the Friday daily Mass from 8 am to 12:10 pm, and First Reconciliation (11), First Communion (10), and Confirmation (7). The feasibility study regarding possible re-opening of St Bernard School has not yet happened, and Erie just closed another grade school at Blessed Sacrament. We will explore youth ministry here, hopefully talking with others who have something going. Also, an Outreach Committee could be in the works to welcome people back and the new folks who've joined our community. Catholic Women, Knights, and Rosary Altar groups reviewed their latest activities. Dan Lang spoke about Communities of Transformation (other local churches are helping) and perhaps some parishioners could get onboard. 

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.
