



■ Summertime ... and the reading is easy. ■ I hope you'll forgive my misquote of the lyrics from Porgy and Bess, but it's a good time to catch up on some extra inspiration. Here are a couple of books to consider.

Some good fiction is healthy and I turned to *The Lincoln Highway* (2021) by Amor Towles. It's one of those cross-country stories that takes many different twists and turns off the title road (US

Route 30) and mission. Emmett is released from a juvenile detention center and with his kid brother, Billy, and two other companions set off to find his mother, presumably at the far end of the road (San Francisco). However, their adventures take them through many different venues too wild to imagine. The characters always have more than meets the eye and keep you wanting to know "how it turns out."


A book I've had on my shelf for years – and finally read – is the thriller *The Day of the Jackal* (1971) by Frederick Forsyth. One priest nicknamed me "jackal", owing to my family name, and I enjoy the tongue-in-cheek connection to the scriptural allusions (see Isaiah 35:7). The story grabbed me many years ago from the 1973 film version, about the plot to assassinate French President Charles de Gaulle. Quite a page-turner!

Speaking of page-turners, I picked up John Grisham's **A Time for Mercy** (2020). The lawyer-turned-writer added another engrossing story about a teenaged boy shooting his mother's boyfriend, in whose house they were living. The boyfriend happens to be a deputy sheriff and the place is Mississippi, where it seems everyone has already decided that he should be put to death. But, of course, there's a lot more to the story, the local dynamics, as well as the courtroom drama and matters of right and wrong.

And, speaking of pages, I decided to open James Michener's **Texas** (1985), since I would be heading to San Antonio for my sabbatical next month. From the days of the Spanish explorers to modern times, Michener traces families through all the generations as they experience the real history of a place (I had already read his *Chesapeake, Hawaii*, and *Alaska*). Once you've read one of his books, you become somewhat well-versed on this part of the world. The second section of *Texas* is on Mission, which describes the earliest days of Bejar / Bexar – along the San Antonio River – with the Spanish, Mexican, Native American, German, and others who navigated to this spot. It helps one to have perspective. Happy reading to you.






Feast of St. Benedict—Have you ever wanted to change the world? 5th century Europe was a dark place. The Roman Empire had fallen, and barbarian tribes were picking over the scraps of what remained. Faith hung on, but there was no consistent, coherent Christian culture in the world around. Young Benedict began his life with education and privilege but became disillusioned by a life pursuing material success. He withdrew to a monastery and spent much time in solitude. He began attracting followers, whom he organized over time into 12 monasteries, with a 13th established to train young monks. He wrote a rule of life including basic principles for living as Christ. His monks took three vows: conversion to Christ, obedience to the local abbot. and stability to remain with the community. Benedictine monasteries became lights in the darkness, secure centers of Christian culture enlivening the faithful beyond their walls. When the world around us seems complicated and contrary to the Gospel, how will you be a light?

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class.
