

As we approach a wonderful holiday, Thanksgiving, let's also consider an approaching Holy Day - Immaculate Conception.

This year, December 8<sup>th</sup> falls on a Sunday – the Second Sunday of Advent. Our practice has been to transfer the Solemnity of Immaculate Conception to Monday, December 9<sup>th</sup>, but not transfer the obligation for attending Mass. That has changed.

We still observe the Advent Sunday (lighting the second candle of our wreath), but now we gather again to celebrate that our Blessed Mother was preserved from original sin even from the first mo-

ment of her conception in the womb of her mother, Anne, nine months before her birth. We truly contemplate the amazing wonder of the gift of human life in the womb AND celebrate our nation's consecration to Mary under this title: Immaculate Conception. Each nation has, besides Christmas, an important Holy Day of Obligation under the patronage of a saint. (Saint Patrick in Ireland, for example, and Mary Mother of God in Canada)

So, we have scheduled sufficient Masses for parishioners to attend – both on Monday (8 am and 12:10 pm) as well as anticipating Sunday evening (5:30 pm). All will be held at St Francis Church, since the Divine Mercy Chapel is too small to accommodate any of these. So, plan now to share in the gift of Eucharistic graces as we remember yet another way our God has provided saving grace to us all!







#### BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

**MEMBERSHIP:** All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

**MARRIAGE:** Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

#### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the homebound on a regular basis.
