




Hard to believe it is already September. This is one wonderful month of the year – weatherwise and new possibilities. Hope you got some good reading in over the summer. Here are some of my favorites:

We all suspect that some death row inmates are innocent, and lawyer Brian Stevenson is very intent on getting justice for them, but one story that truly stands out is Anthony Ray Hinton's *The Sun Does Shine: How I Found Life and Freedom on Death Row* (2018). Here is

a man who could not possibly have committed the crimes for which he was sent away and sentenced to die, and the excruciating pitfalls of the criminal justice system in a southern state for an African-American man. It shines a light on so many issues that need fixing. I only wish this story could have been told a little more succinctly. But, then, since his own vindication was dragged out so long, it does make a greater impact to tell it this way.

Why not a little pure science? Neil DeGrasse Tyson has written *Astrophysics for People in a Hurry* (2017). Perhaps you know this author has taken the place of Carl Sagan in our modern world, and like Sagan he has little use for religion. But when he says things like "we have attained true cosmic vision after seeing the unseeable," (referring to infrared and ultraviolet radiation) and his explanation that dark matter and dark energy make up the major portion of the matter-energy inventory of the universe – you can begin to draw your own faith-filled conclusions. This book is a kind of short course on the topic, not really an astronomy book (about stars and planets) but what makes them behave as they do and their relationships to each other. Maybe it's not your cup of tea – but it was, refreshingly, mine.

I had never sat down with E.M. Forster, but just read two of his novels, one of which was **Howard's End** (1910). It's set in England – both London and a couple rural areas not far away – and deals with the social conventions and human relations of a few intertwining families. Whom can you trust? What skeletons are in your closet? Why do people treat each other so? Such things revolve around the so-named home, which includes the tension between poverty and wealth, men and women, family and acquaintances. One commentator mentioned it gives a pretty good snapshot of Europe (and the tensions between nations) before the two World Wars changed that forever. What have you learned lately?





BULLETIN INFORMATION MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY NOON ON FRIDAY 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO BULLETIN DATE.

MEMBERSHIP: All Baptized Catholics should be registered, practicing and supporting members of a Parish. Only properly registered members appear on our parish list and are eligible to receive the benefits of parish membership for sacraments. Each parishioner is called upon to practice good stewardship of time, talent and treasure. If you are not currently receiving envelopes, you may not be registered. Call the Parish Office - we would love to meet you!

MARRIAGE: Couples need to contact a priest *at least six months before their wedding*. Registered and active participation needs to be considered before marriage.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

We welcome all inquiries about the Catholic faith. This **RCIA** process begins in the fall of the year. Please call the Parish Office for further information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the Parish Office to request the Sacrament of the Sick for family members who are seriously ill. Communion for the sick is taken to the hospital, nursing homes, and the home-bound on a regular basis.

BAPTISM: Both parents must attend the Pre-Baptism Preparation Program. Please call the St. Bernard Parish Office for dates and times of upcoming class. Baptisms are scheduled after completing the program. Call the Parish Office to schedule the class and baptism. Godparents must be at least 16, confirmed and active, registered members of their parish.
